Course: **SP100, Introduction to the School of the Prophets**

Date: 8 week directed study by arrangement with the instructor.

Texts: "School of the Prophets, Origin: Book 1" and "School of the Prophets, Community: Book 2."

Credits: 2 credits

Syllabus

Topics of Study

This course provides an introduction on the origin of the School of the Prophets and the structure of the community of the School of the Prophets as it was found in Israel in 1000 BC under Samuel and carried into the British isles by 500 BC by Jeremiah and again with the message of Messiah Y'Shua by 38 AD by Joseph of Arimethia.. Students will be presented with the long history, polity with an overview of the life-style of the School of the Prophets with the focus on enabling a student to develop modern villages of prophets in living from the resources of the land.

A review of the Brehon laws of Ireland reminiscent of the School of the Prophets founded there by Jeremiah in 500 BC there will show the benefits of a close association with the land and the food it produces as the core economic system identified as 'cow money' from which all other values are compared and derived. The eleven historic covenants of YHWH with mankind will be reviewed from the beginning of time with clarification on what conditions of these covenants are valid or binding, what has passed away and what is yet to come.

This course will further provide the structure of the schools as modeled after the mother church in Jerusalem after the day of Pentecost in circa 40-70 AD as described in the Didache as the Teaching of the Apostles as the only biblical model for the structure of the Hebrew-Christian church and for the School of the Prophets as led by Prophets and Teachers. Students will also learn how to judge prophecies to determine if they are of God or of Satan or created by their own minds. Prophecies in this context come in the form of words or premonitions, visions and dreams.

Coursework

Students will be expected to write weekly responses to questions based on assigned readings from two books especially written for this course by Dr. Mar David Michael with over 600 pages of information including over 100 recent prophecies given to the members of the School of the Prophets about the end times. In addition, students will keep a log or journal of their prophecies, premonitions, visions and dreams during this course to be submitted to the instructor each week for comment. Students will finally be expected to write a 5 page minimum final research paper with cited sources on a chosen topic presented in this course as approved by the instructor.
